MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT – STORM DRAINAGE CRITERIA & STANDARDS Consideration on second reading of an ordinance amending the Loveland

Municipal Code at Sections 13.18.100, 16.24.014, and 16.24.015 concerning the City of Loveland Storm Drainage Criteria and the City of Loveland Storm Drainage Standards

This is a legislative item to adopt an ordinance amending Sections 13.18.100, 16.24.014, and 16.24.015 of the Loveland Municipal Code concerning the City of Loveland Storm Drainage Criteria ("Criteria") and the City of Loveland Storm Drainage Standards ("Standards"). These amendments will clean up and correct sections of the City Code where the references to Criteria and Standards were absent, or incorrect. City Council unanimously approved the first reading of the ordinance on October 2, 2012.

The adoption of the 2012 mill levy is a legislative action. Included are all the fee resolutions and ordinances necessary to adopt and implement the 2013 Budget. City Council unanimously approved the first reading of the ordinances and the resolutions on October 2, 2012.

2013 BUDGET FOR THE LOVELAND SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT #1 Consideration on second reading of an ordinance adopting the 2013 budget for the Loveland Special Improvement District #1

This is an administrative action. The City serves as the sponsoring agency for the Special Improvement District (SID) and the ex officio Board of Directors. The SID #1 was established to allow for the collection of assessments from property owners in the District to back bonded debt used to construct infrastructure improvements in the district. The City does not have any legal obligation towards this debt. By State law, all special districts with a connection to the City must adopt a budget. The City of Loveland serves as staff for the District. City Council unanimously approved the first reading of the ordinance on October 2, 2012.

Consideration on second reading of an ordinance adopting the 2013 budget for the Loveland Urban Renewal Authority

This is an administrative action. City Council serves as the Board of Commissioners for the Loveland Urban Renewal Authority. By State budget law, the Board must approve an annual budget for the Authority. The City of Loveland serves as staff for the Authority. The Authority is funded by tax increment revenues from property and sales taxes. City Council unanimously approved the first reading of the ordinance on October 2, 2012.

City Council unanimously approved the first reading of the ordinance on October 2, 2012.

2013 AIRPORT BUDGET

Consideration on second reading of an ordinance adopting the 2013 budget for the Fort Collins-Loveland Municipal Airport

This is an administrative action. The City of Loveland provides staff support to the Airport through the Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Ft. Collins. As a part of this function the City Council approves the Airport budget, which includes the City's share of the Airport budget. City Council unanimously approved the first reading of the ordinance on October 2, 2012.

WINDY GAP FIRMING PROJECT

Consideration of Resolution #R-68-2012 approving and authorizing the execution of a Sixth Amendment to the Fourth Interim Agreement with the Municipal Subdistrict, Northern Colorado Water Conservancy District Windy Gap Firming Project Water Activity Enterprise, for participation in the Windy Gap Firming Project

This is an administrative action to adopt a Resolution approving a Sixth Amendment to the Fourth Interim Agreement to provide additional funding to complete the environmental permitting process for the Windy Gap Firming Project ("WGFP"). A total of \$1,000,000 is requested from the WGFP participants collectively; Loveland's portion of \$81,225 represents Loveland's 8.12% interest in the WGFP. Funding is available from revenues saved in the Raw Water Fund for this purpose.

MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT – FLOODPLAIN REGULATIONS

Consideration on first reading of an ordinance amending the Loveland Municipal Code at Sections 15.14.020, 15.14.040, 15.14.050, 15.14.060, 15.14.070, 15.14.074, 15.14.080, 18.45.030, 18.45.060, and adding 18.45.065 concerning the City of Loveland floodplain building code and floodplain regulations

This is a legislative item to adopt an ordinance amending Sections 15.14.020, 15.14.040, 15.14.050, 15.14.060, 15.14.070, 15.14.074, 15.14.080, 18.45.030, 18.45.060, and adding 18.45.065 of the Loveland Municipal Code concerning the City of Loveland Floodplain Building Code and Floodplain Regulations. These amendments are required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Colorado Water Conservation Board in order to remain compliant under the National Flood Insurance Program.

REVISIONS TO STORM DRAINAGE STANDARDS

Consideration of Resolution #R-69-2012 ratifying and reaffirming the City of Loveland Storm Drainage Standards and approving amendments thereto dated August 15, 2012

This is a legislative action for approval of a resolution adopting the revised City of Loveland Storm Drainage Standards. The objective of the revised City of Loveland Storm Drainage Standards is to make minor modifications to our Stormwater Quality Program to be more in line with how these documents are actually being used by both the contractors and the City inspectors.

This item is a legislative action to consider approval on first reading of an ordinance amending Section 2.60.130 of the Loveland Municipal Code. The Historic Preservation Commission unanimously recommends that the City Council amend the code to provide for a designated slot for a representative of the Loveland Historical Society.

SUBLEASE AGREEMENT WITH HOUSE OF NEIGHBORLY SERVICE

Consideration of Resolution #R-70-2012 approving a sublease agreement with the House of Neighborly Service for real property leased by the City of Loveland and located at 137 S. Lincoln Avenue in Loveland, Colorado

This is an administrative action. The City of Loveland has entered into a contract to lease the property at 137 S. Lincoln Avenue in Loveland, Colorado from the owner Galen Stoltzfus. The lease expires on October 31, 2013 unless terminated sooner in accordance with the terms of the lease. The City is now entering into a sublease agreement with the House of Neighborly Service for social work offices, client services and operation of a day shelter. The current lease begins the fourth year of City of Loveland support for services located at 137 S. Lincoln Avenue.

PUBLIC HEARING

AMEND MIRASOL COMMUNITY GENERAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Consideration on first reading of an ordinance amending Section 18.04.040 of the Loveland Municipal Code, the same relating to zoning regulations for property located in the "Mirasol First Subdivision" to the City of Loveland, Larimer County, Colorado

This is a quasi-judicial action to consider an ordinance on first reading that would amend the density, maximum number of units and off-street parking ratios established in the Mirasol Community General Development Plan. The Mirasol PUD consists of 24 acres located south of 4th Street SE, east of S. Madison Avenue and west of S. St. Louis Avenue. The applicant is the Housing Authority of the City of Loveland.

FUND BALANCE PRESENTATION
