**Call to Order**: The meeting was called to order at 4:30 pm.

#### **Third Quarter Financial Report**

Third Quarter Financial Report information was handed out to Commission members and discussed by staff. There are savings in Parks personnel account to pay for a Parks Worker at Mehaffey Park. Lottery & Park CEFs are funding Mehaffey Park. Parks & Recreation Department operations look really good for the third quarter of 2014. First reading of 2015 budget went to City Council last Tuesday. No decision was made and another meeting will be held next week. Operation costs are estimated at \$6,000/an acre per year. The Department will need additional funding for 2016 at Mehaffey Park for operations.

## **High Plains School Agreement/Park Design**

Staff presented a map to Commission showing proposed park design. The City will contribute one million dollars; McWhinney \$200,000 and R2J \$800,000 towards the park by High Plains School. This park will be an accessible neighborhood park with partial fencing and landscaping.

## **High Plains Art Council Agreement**

Some minor changes were done to the agreement which was previously presented to Commission members. High Palins Art Council will be required to develop a Master Plan for development at North Lake Park. The area for sculpture placement will be between Loveland High School and the pond area. High Plains Art Council would like to expand further into North Lake Park, but this park is heavily used by the public, and athletic programming and is not feasible for sculpture placement. Many City residents use this park for day use during the year.

# **Commission Members Discussion**

Staff discussed with Commission members future involvement in the trail connection to Fort Collins and the feasibility study for a second Recreation Center and outdoor pool.
