<u>DRS Report:</u> Dave said that the Homeless Connect function, which provides information on services available, has been scheduled. Dave reported that there is a program for Medicaid recipients that lack transportation which might apply to the person that wanted to apply to DAC. The program provides cab rides after 6:00 p.m. He said to refer people to him, if they would like information on this program.

<u>DAC Webpage and Brochure Modifications:</u> Members were fine with the revised webpage that had been sent out. Bettie confirmed that phone numbers and website links are current. DAC's brochure will now be updated to match the webpage.

The Senior Advisory Board's walk downtown was this morning. Taylor said she attended and provided a lot of input. Bettie mentioned that the City received a complaint about a section of sidewalk on Lincoln south of 4th Street. Public Works looked at the sidewalk and is fixing the problem. Bettie also mentioned that the FTA has implemented new rules regarding accommodating passengers. COLT has received information on these requirements.

<u>Disabilities Awareness Events:</u> Bettie discussed that the Community Partnership Division has been providing training on Effective Communication to local non-profits that work in conjunction with the City. The training has been an eye-opener for the non-profits. Many people were unaware of the ADA requirements beyond physical access. One more training is scheduled in November. After this training, many of these non-profits might be interested in participating in Disabilities Awareness Events.
