Attending key board and commission meetings. Debby is going to attend Transportation, Leah is a liaison to Affordable Housing.

Solidify our link to the Ft. Collins ~~SAB~~ SABP by attending their meeting 2 or 3 times a year.

Cultivate partnerships with other agencies that advocate for seniors.

Foster intergenerational experiences whenever possible.
