

## Disability Advisory Committee 2017 Goals

- More Visibility for the Disabled Community
  - Desire to get more information out to the public about resources
  - Desire to use various methods to communicate the information (internet, flyers, bulletin boards, public events, etc.)
  - Each board member may adopt one or more community agencies to establish a relationship with and facilitate conversation and information flow.
- Communicate with/ be updated by COL Transit department on bus stop accessibility
  - o Disseminate this information out to the Public
- Communicate with/be updated by COL Parks & Rec about accessibility and opportunities
  - o Disseminate this information out to the Public
- Pass a motion to allow the Chairperson to request a resolution be drafted to amend the current size of the DAC Board membership
- Meet with the COL Public Information Officer, Tom Hacker, to understand if/how the COL social media sites may be utilized by the DAC board.
- Assist the COL ADA Coordinator with the City's planned updates for the Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan.
- Develop a calendar of events for the year that DAC wishes to participate in to facilitate preparedness and planning. (i.e. Corn Roast)



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• Assist the COL with accessibility concerns as stated in the DAC homepage:

The Disabilities Advisory Commission makes recommendations to the City Council on problems relating to people with disabilities and their interaction with the community. In addition, the commission reviews building and development plans and advises city staff on matters of accessibility.

The commission also:

- Represents the interests of persons with disabilities.
- Helps solve individual's accessibility problems.
- Encourages and educates the general public through participatory events.
- Addresses accessibility issues pertaining to city or government buildings and Parks & Recreation, and other city services.
