Introduction of The Olde Course Maintenance Staff and 2017 Goals	Dennis reviewed the information included in the packet. 2017 Accomplishments and goals include:
	<ul> <li>Leveled and replaced sod on driving range tee</li> <li>Fixed #1 tee area including new curbing; addressed drainage issues and replaced sod.</li> <li>Renovated practice green by driving range – reshaped and reseeded.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Built 3 new forward tees on holes 2, 6, and 9</li> <li>Planted new trees between holes 5 and 9</li> </ul>
	Dennis also provided updates on the goose and tree maintenance
	programs.
Industry Snapshot	Steve related that golf industry research in showing participation rates dropping for past 10 years; the rate of overall decrease during that time is an approximate 22%. The overall golf population is aging and, as a whole, the industry is not good at replacing with younger golfers.
Mariana Butte Trail: Follow up	Steve distributed trail plans and revised signage maps. He also reviewed trail location, and direction.
	Discussion included review of safety measures and liability of golfers regarding hikers; types and location of signage; golf staff training. No action taken.

Budget 2018 Budget Package Summary	<ul> <li>Steve Southard gave a presentation and reviewed a draft of 2018 projected revenues and expenditures, including the proposed10-year capital improvement plan. Summary:</li> <li>No fee increases are proposed</li> <li>Budget will see an increase in expenses related to seasonal wages as minimum wage increases per new regulations</li> <li>Expense transfers for internal general City services (i.e. accounting, human resources, city attorney, etc.) increased significantly.</li> <li>10-year cash flow plan reflects a predicted overall revenue decrease of 2.5% for 2018 in anticipation of the new TPC course.</li> <li>Steve noted that, while the new TPC course will bring competition, having competition, the level of the TPC course could only make the Loveland courses better as staff takes a look at our facilities for needed improvements, etc.</li> </ul> Joe Lopo moved that the 2018 proposed budget be accepted as presented; Chuck Weirauch seconded with unanimous approval.

Board Member Comments	Jack Stringer: Like the new sample tee sign on hole #5. Yardage marker posts need to be repainted. Rex Lamoreaux: Why doesn't Loveland have a 1 <sup>st</sup> Tee program like Denver. Has Loveland ever considered offering golf camps that last 3-4 hours a day for a limited time? Julie Nelson: Tried to buy a youth putter from CCGC, only putters offered for sale were left-handed. Played SNAG with young daughter – daughter won hole #5. Sat next to couple on patio at CCGC whose first date was on the Mini-Course. Robert Walkowicz: Regarding citizen from last meeting, Dean Dobbins, and his house on #7 at MBGC – wondering if there is anything that could be done to help e.g. planting trees.
