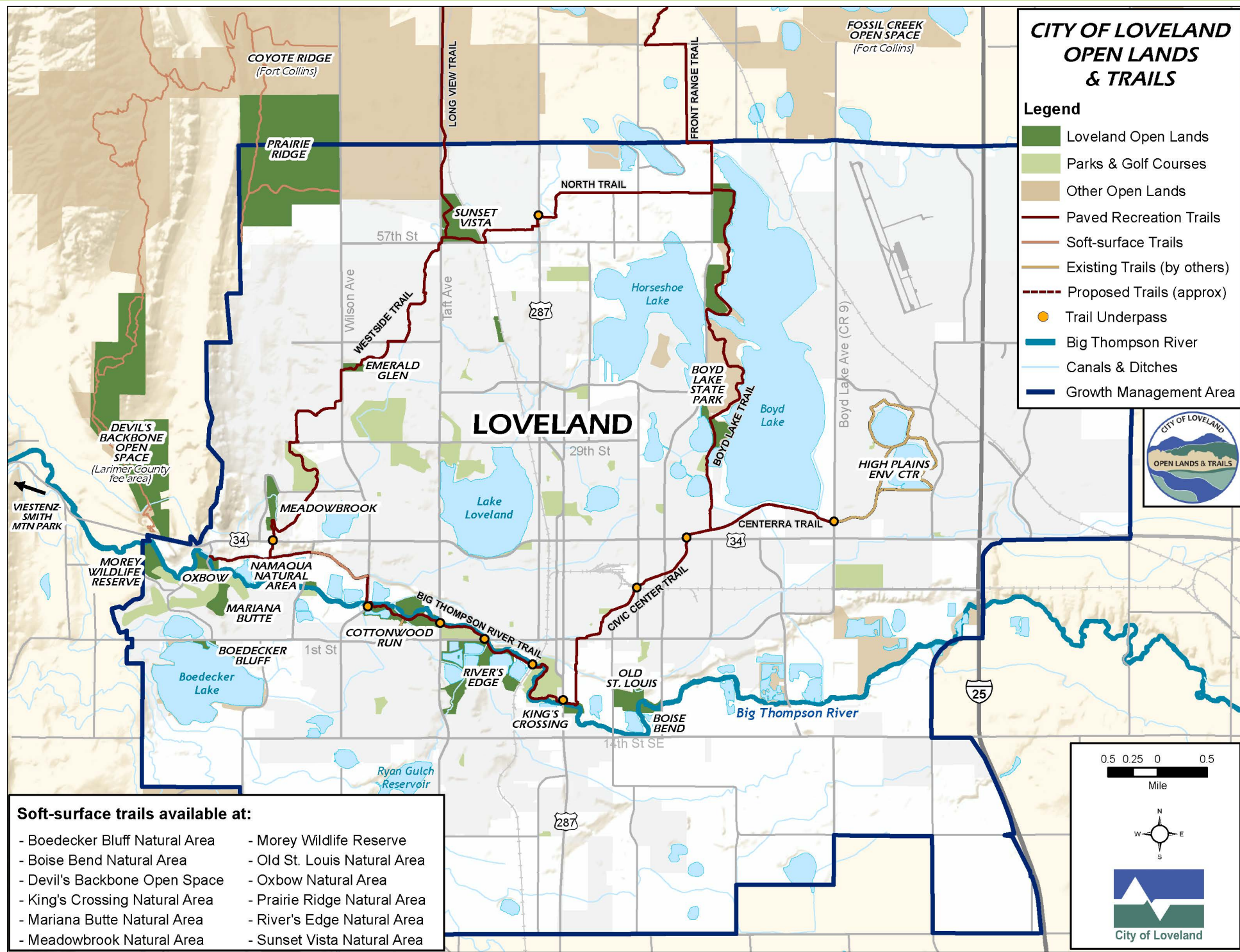


Rules & Regulations

- Hours: 6:00A to 10:30P (except Morey Wildlife Reserve, Prairie Ridge Natural Area, Viestenz-Smith Mountain Park and Mariana Butte Trails, which are open from sunrise to sunset)
- Report accidents and emergencies directly to the Loveland Police Department (911); non-emergency police: 970.667.2151
- Report maintenance concerns or vandalism to the Parks & Recreation Department, 970.962.2727
- Parking is allowed in designated areas only
- Pets must be leashed and under control at all times
- Pet owners must pick up and remove pet waste
- Pets are NOT allowed at Prairie Ridge Natural Area or Morey Wildlife Reserve
- Fishing is regulated by Colorado State Regulations; all anglers age 16+ must have a Colorado Fishing License
- Bicycling permitted on designated trails only (not permitted at Morey Wildlife Reserve or Mariana Butte Trails); Type I and II e-bikes are allowed where bikes are allowed (except Prairie Ridge Natural Area – NO e-bikes)
- Bicyclists yield to other trail users
- Noise ordinance is strictly enforced
- Shade structures are available for drop-in use and are not reservable, except for city-authorized programs

PROHIBITED

- Overnight parking or camping
- Glass containers/bottles
- Open fires or flames; gathering or cutting firewood
- Smoking or vaping
- Motorized vehicles outside of established streets and parking areas (except authorized)
- Remote control (RC) motorized vehicles; no drones
- Littering, graffiti or markings on facilities or trail
- Alcoholic beverages
- Swimming, wading, boating, ice skating, ice fishing and bow fishing (float tube "belly boat" fishing allowed ONLY at River's Edge Natural Area except at Jayhawker North Pond)
- Horses in open lands or on trails (except at Prairie Ridge via Coyote Ridge trail, and police use)
- Feeding, trapping, and disturbing wildlife
- Discharge or use of firearms, projectiles or fireworks
- Collecting, removing, destroying or defacing any natural or manmade object or surface
- Vending in open lands or on trails (except with prior permission/permit from the Parks & Recreation Department)
- Private landscaping or use of open lands or trails (and easements on which they are located) including extensions of backyard landscaping, trash or rubbish dumping or other unauthorized use
- Any encroachment or storage of privately owned items in open lands or on trails
