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POLICE CITIZEN'S ADVISORY BOARD FEBRUARY 4, 2019 TRAINING ROOM Present: Chair Pat Kistler, Ed Gassman, Dick Hunsaker, Alan Lipowitz, Shannon Dapkus, Bev Cardarelli, Greg Bland, Kathy Mitchell and John Tindall. Absent: Erin Frisch. Other attendees: Chief Ticer; Lt. Pyle, Keri Lawler and Councilor Don Overcash

The meeting was called to order at 5:45 PM by Chair Pat Kistler. A motion was made and seconded respectively by Kathy Mitchell and Bev Cardarelli to approve the minutes as is. Motion carried. All approved.

CHIEF TICER

- Chief had everyone introduce themselves to Keri Lawler, Administrative Analyst, who then introduced herself as well as a little background history.
- ▶ Updated the Board on crime and traffic statistics for the month of December 2018. Stated that calls for service for 2018 were 100,000 plus. Additionally Chief also explained Part I crimes and UCR crime reporting (NIBRS) It is very important that we report both UCR and Part I crimes. Note: 82.1.4 UCR/NIBRS A written directive establishes procedures for collecting and submitting crime data to a national uniform crime reporting program or national incident-based reporting system, or state system if one exists.
- Car crashes are slowly decreasing and officers are being very proactive on traffic citations and the officers give out a lot of warnings which is a great communication tool between the officer and the offender.

LT. JEFF PYLE

- Lt. Pyle updated the Board about Operations taking an active approach on educating the public during the holiday season by conducting bicycle stops in the downtown area and adjoining neighborhoods. There was a 27% reduction in shoplifting during this past holiday season.
- Motor vehicle thefts during the holiday season remained the same. Detective Danyel McGraw is in charge of our License Plate Reader vehicle and she has been able to recover several stolen vehicles. Other detectives and patrol are trained to use the LPR as well. A comment by one of our Board members asked if stolen vehicles are stripped. Chief indicated that very rarely are then stripped.
- Lt. Pyle stated that on February 19 the City Council will hear our ordinance on body worn cameras and the IGA for the Police Regional Training Center. Estimated date for groundbreaking is May 1. The money for the PRTC is coming out of the City Council's special projects fund. Board member Tindall made a motion to give permission to Councilor Overcash to speak on behalf of the Police Citizen Advisory Board on the urgency of body worn cameras. Motion carried. All approved.

There being no further business a motion was made and seconded respectively by Ed Gassman and Dick Hunsaker to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. All approved. Meeting adjourned at 7:00 PM
