



City of Loveland Occupational Tax

Occupational Tax is a yearly tax due at the time of a new Liquor License and then when renewing each year after. The State of Colorado gave the City of Loveland the authority to tax establishments that sell alcoholic beverages.

An establishment will be considered delinquent thirty (30) days after renewal due date and 10 days after the approval of a new liquor license, with an interest penalty (1% per month) assessed on the unpaid tax.
