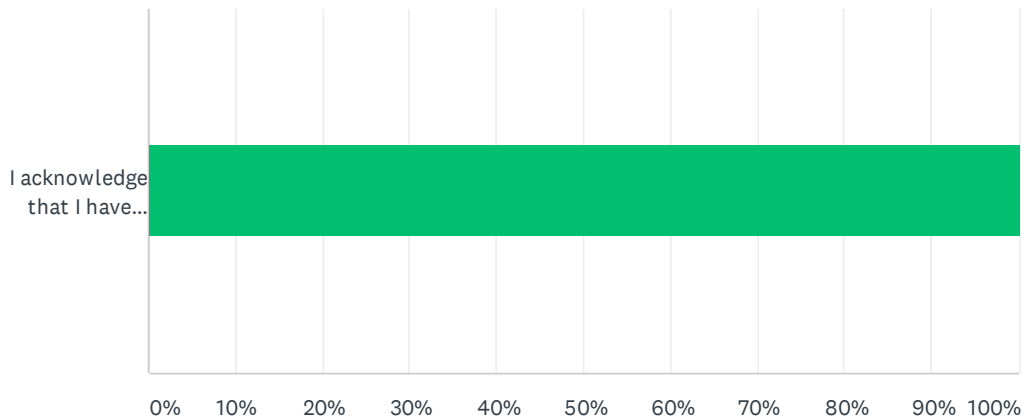

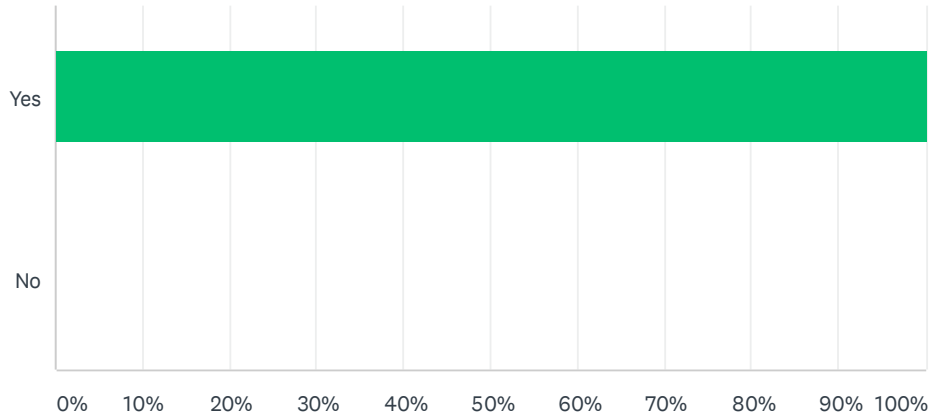

Q2 Are you a Loveland resident?

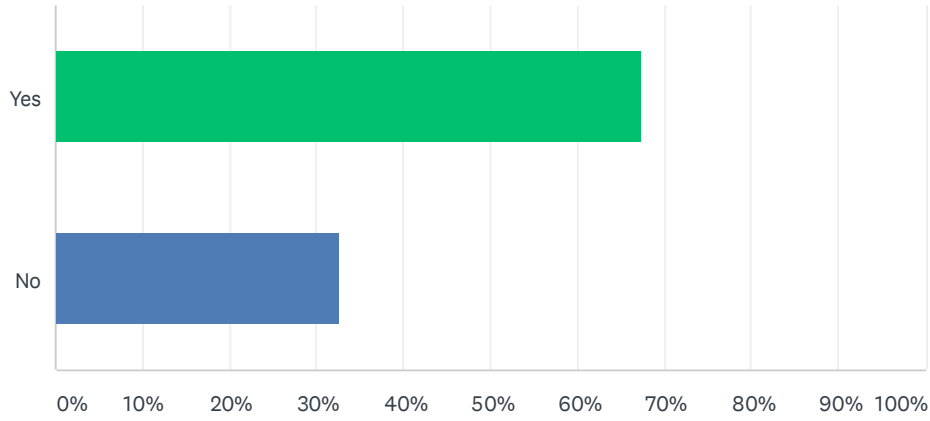

Q3 Have you had or currently have a child, children, or family member adversely affected by the use of tobacco/vaping?

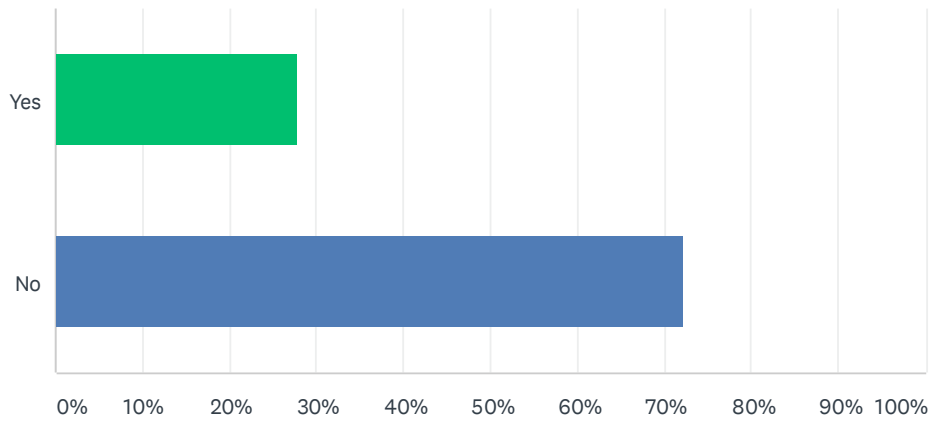

Q4 Have you personally been adversely affected by the use of tobacco/vaping?

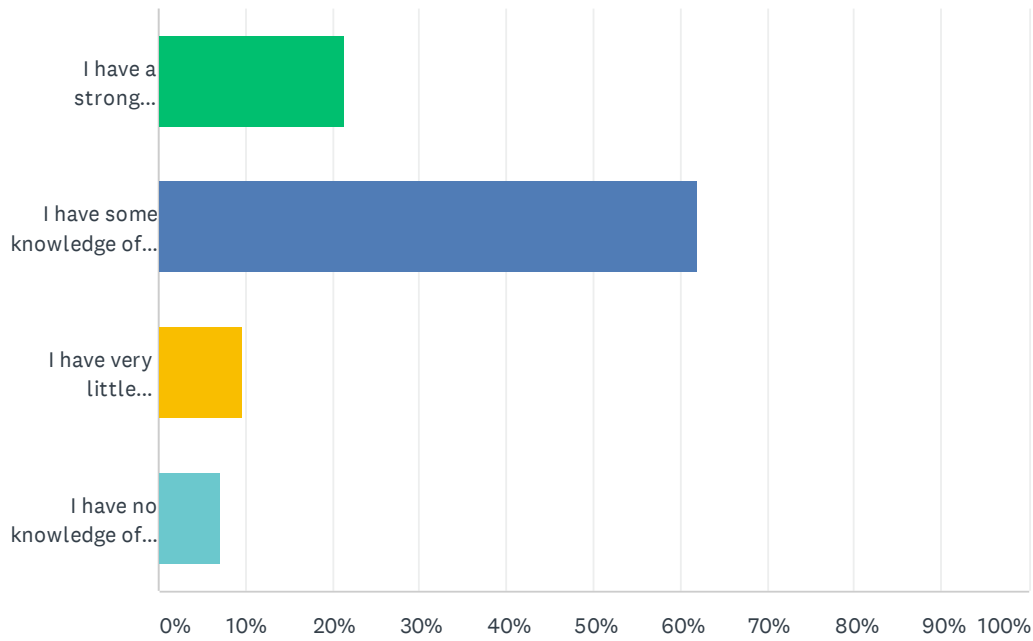

Q7 How familiar are you with the options before council to reduce tobacco product access to youth?

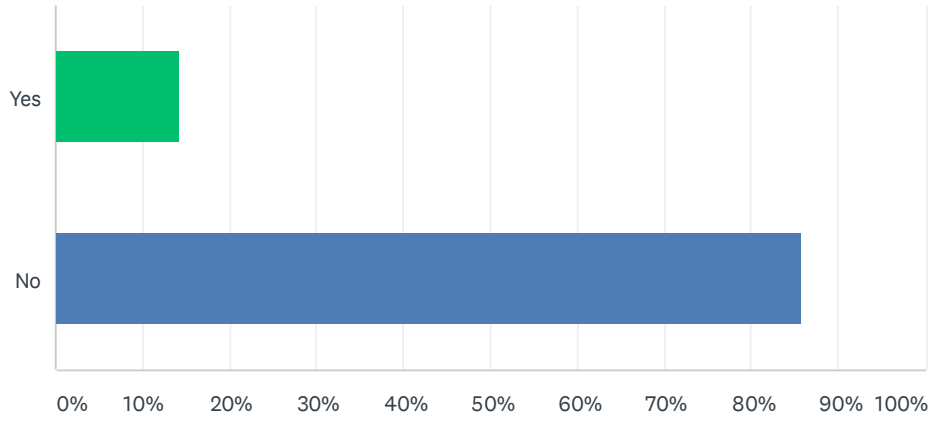

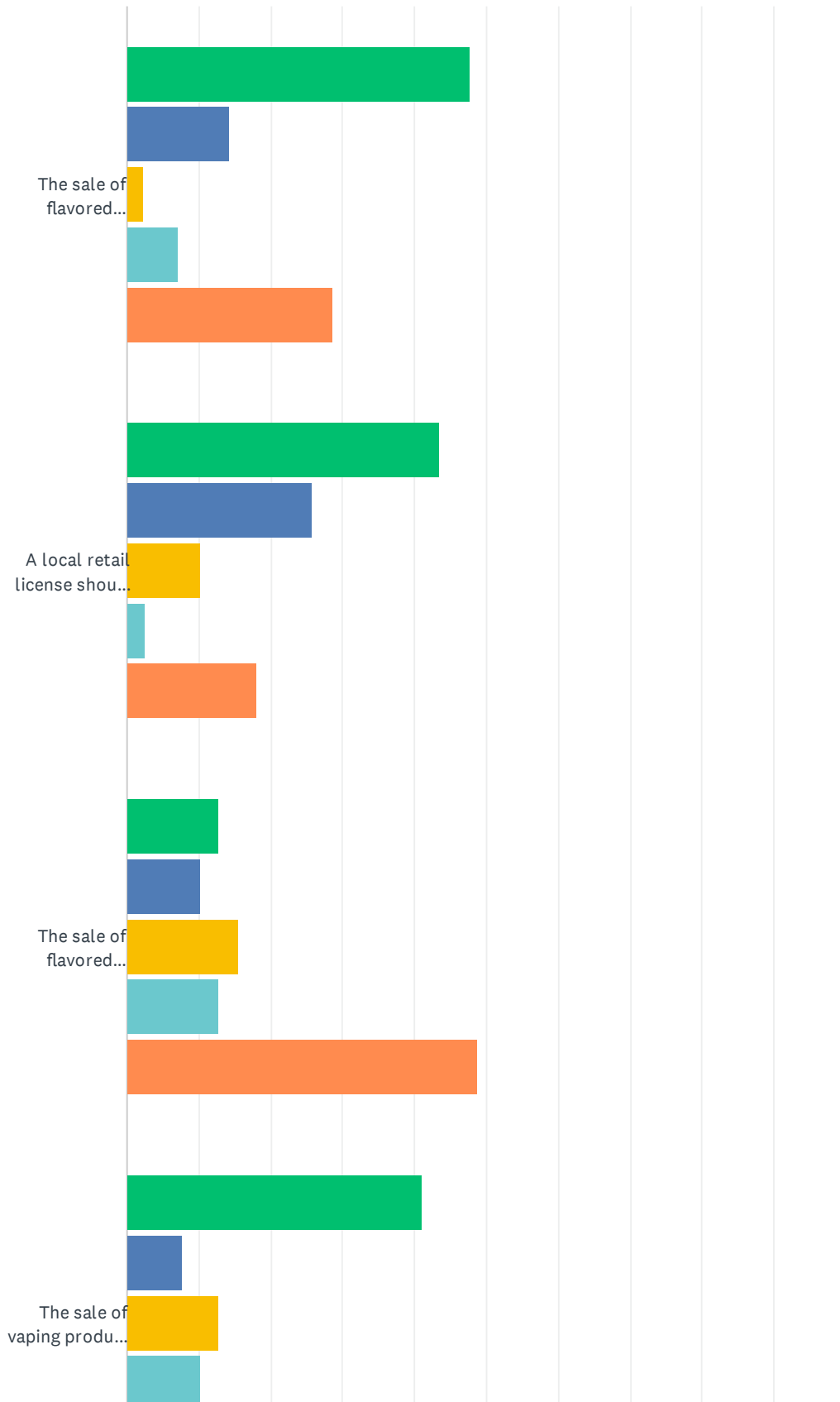

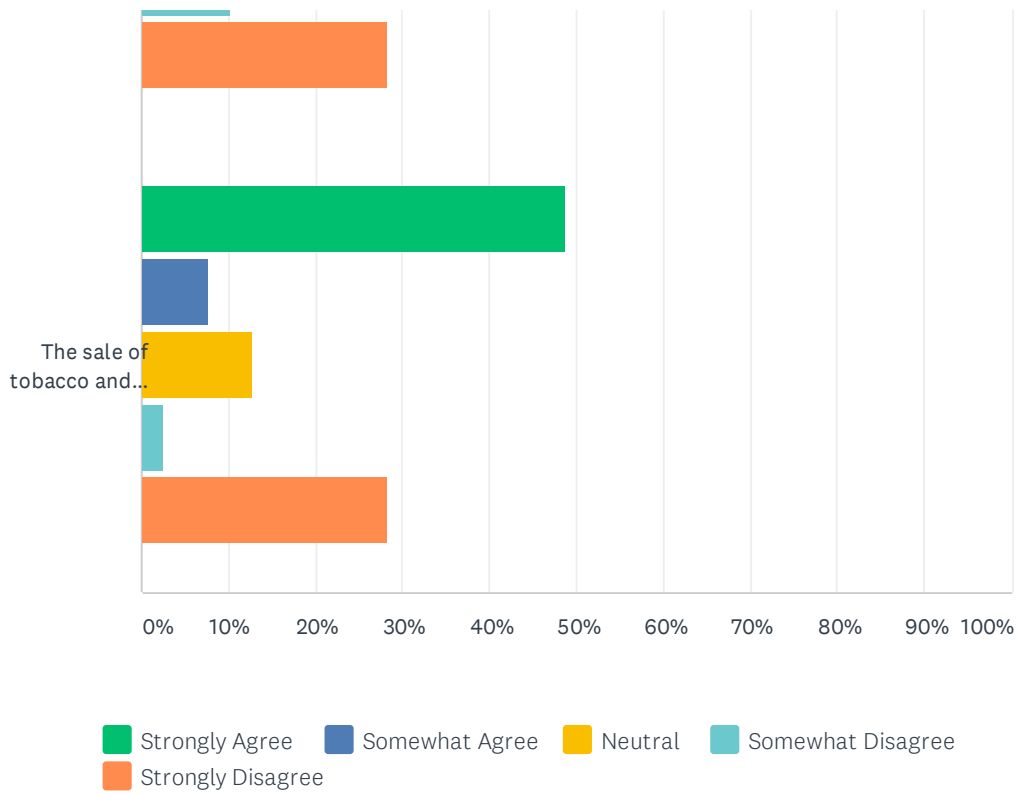

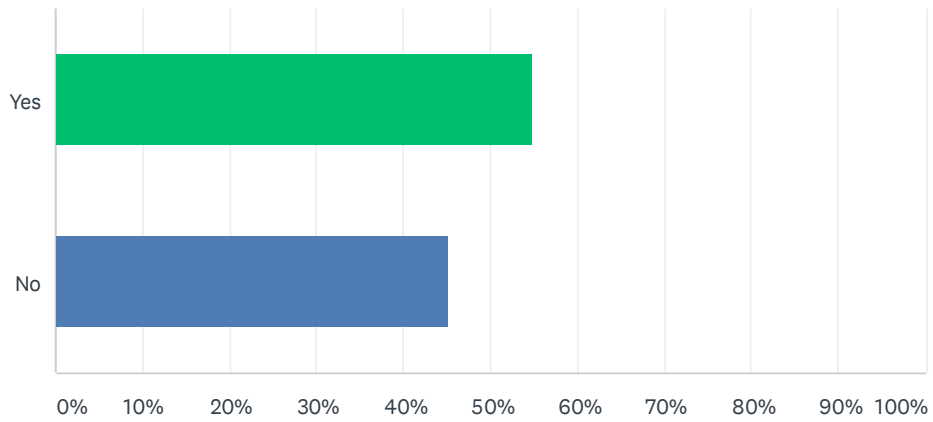

Q10 Do you think a ban on the sale of flavored tobacco/vape in Loveland would reduce usage?

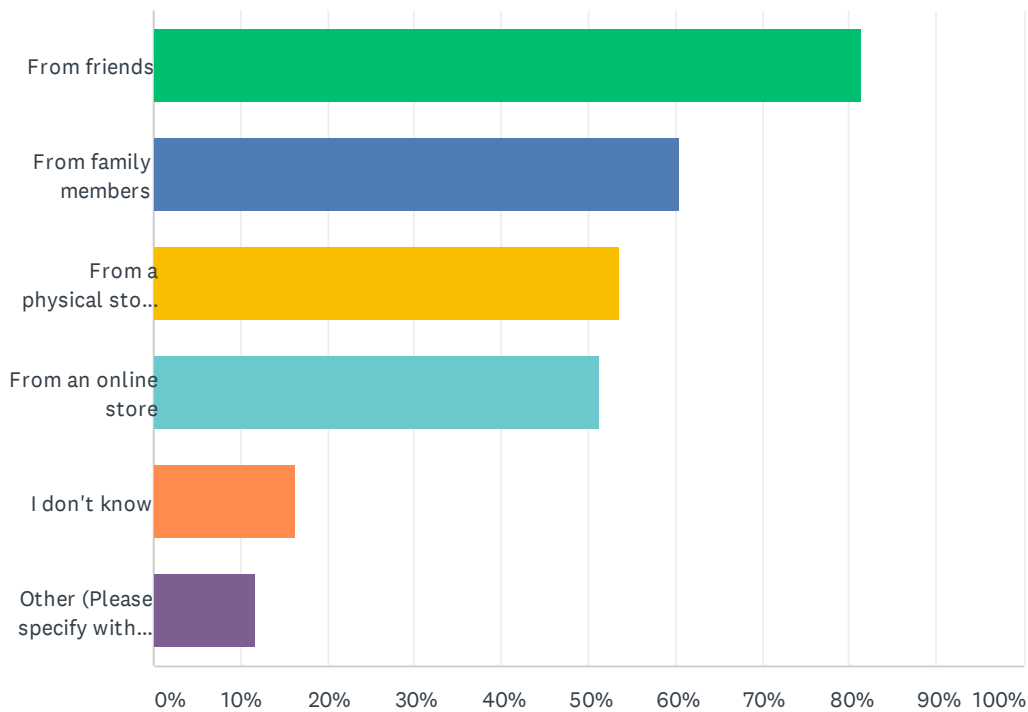

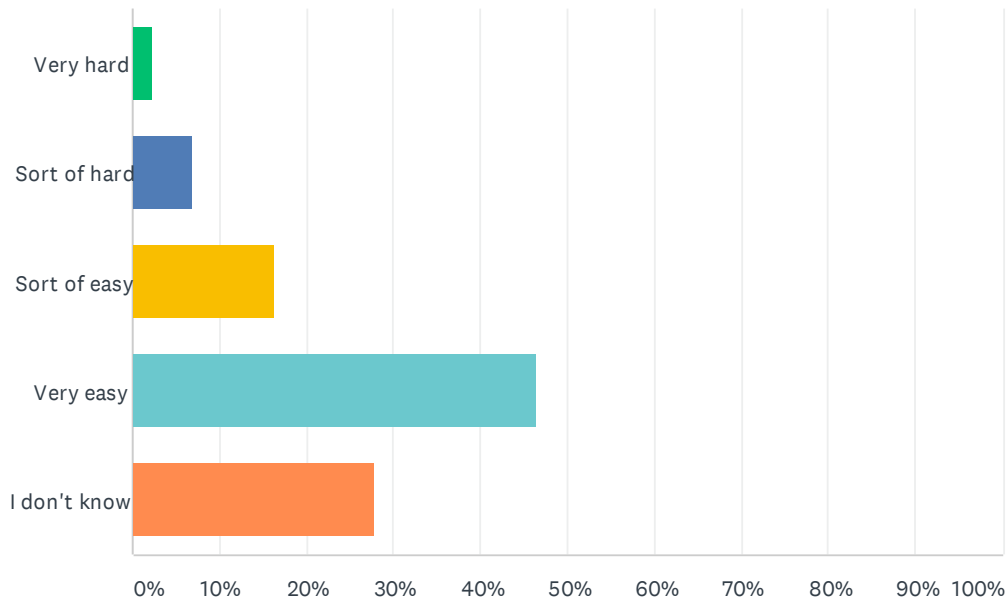

Q12 How easy is it for youth to get flavored tobacco/vape products in Loveland?

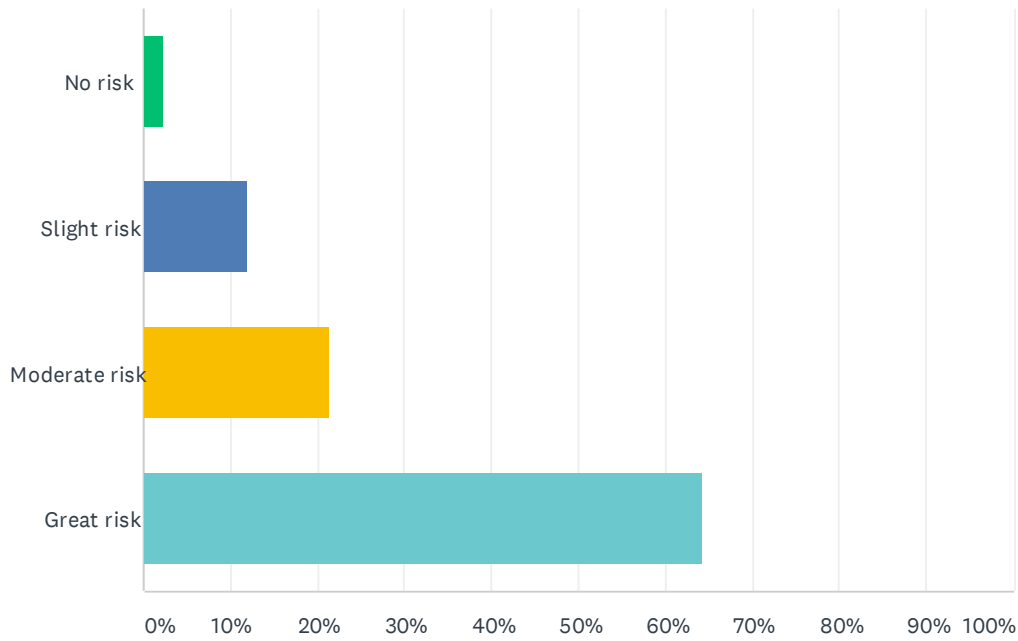

Q13 How much do you think people risk harming themselves if they use tobacco/vape products?

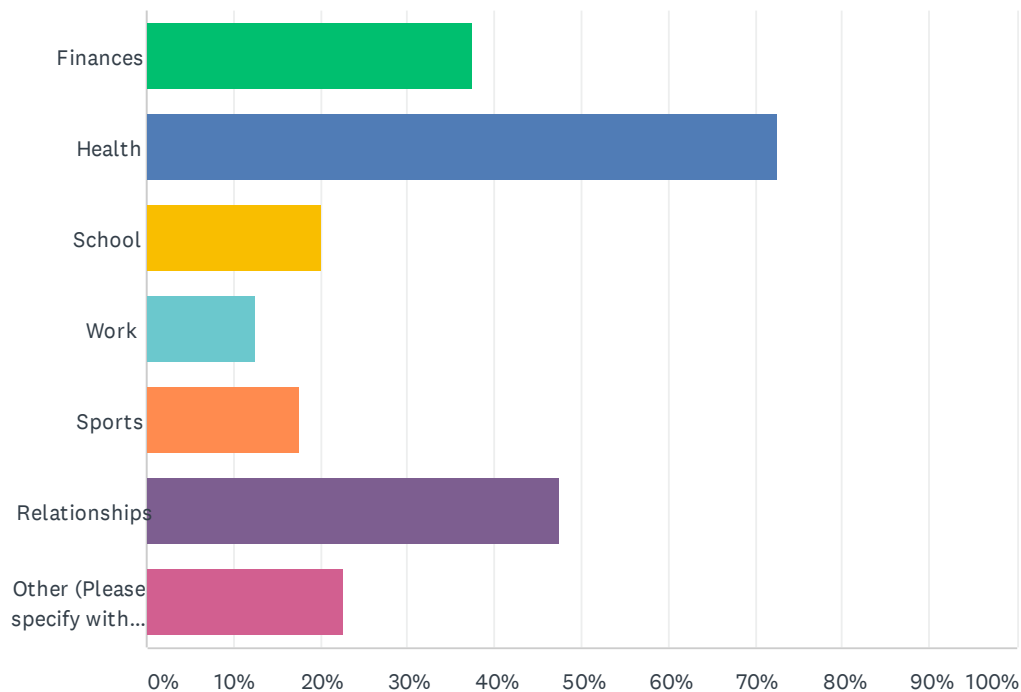
