

The City of Loveland Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for the year ended 2021 from which the information in the Citizen's Financial Report has been drawn, was awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA), for 2020. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition for excellence in state and local government financial reporting.

In order to be awarded a Certificate of Achievement, a government unit must publish an easily readable and efficiently organized comprehensive annual financial report, whose contents conform to program standards. Such Annual Comprehensive Financial Report must satisfy both generally accepted accounting principles and applicable legal requirements.

A Certificate of Achievement is valid for a period of one year only. We believe our Annual Comprehensive Financial Report continues to conform to the Certificate of Achievement program requirements and we are submitting our report for the current year to the GFOA.



# **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

The following is a list of some of the many accomplishments completed during 2021.

#### **Police Training Center**

♦ Completed the Northern Colorado Regional Law Enforcement Training Center with a total cost of \$39.8 million in a 50/50 partnership with the City of Fort Collins.

#### **Loveland Fire Rescue Authority**

♦ In June of 2021, Loveland Fire Rescue Authority began construction of its new Fire Station 10. The station will service the east side of Loveland, shortening response times and improving ISO-ratings for the area.

#### **Water and Power**

♦ Started construction on Chimney Hollow reservoir which will hold 90,000-acre feet of water when completed and filled. The City's share will be 10,000-acre feet of storage in the reservoir.






# **INCOME STATEMENT**






