Planning Your Donation

We are dedicated to ensuring that your donation serves as both a lasting personal tribute and an appropriate public gift. City staff will work with you to determine how you would like to establish your memorial donation on City properties. Your donation includes installation and perpetual maintenance. Please note that donation trees are only planted during May and October while donation benches are only installed in May and June.

6 foot metal bench	\$1,950
1.5–2 inch caliper tree	\$495

Location

Memorial tree plantings are available within designated locations in City parks and cemeteries. Some locations cannot accommodate plaque installation with memorial tree plantings due to maximum capacity or other reasons.

Memorial bench installations are available within designated locations in City parks and along trails. Bench locations require approval for preferred locations and may be limited due to capacity.

Adopting an established tree or existing bench is also part of our Memorial Tree & Bench Program and is encouraged if approved by City staff.

Selecting a Tree

Individuals and organizations may work with urban forestry staff to select an appropriate tree species

for the location identified. Please be aware that any potential tree planted must correspond to our local USDA hardiness zone to prioritize establishment and long term survivability.

Maintenance

Urban forestry staff will arrange for the planting of trees, as well as the maintenance of memorial trees. Family and friends may participate in the tree planting process. Benches will also be installed and maintained by City staff.

Recognition

The City of Loveland permits the installation of a donated plaque with park benches, provided it meets the criteria of the department's Donation Plaque Policy. The Memorial Program Coordinator must approve plaque material, size and wording before the donor orders the plaque.

Plaques must be made of a corrosive-resistant metal, polycarbonate or similar durable material, and of a color that will harmonize with the site furnishing.

The exposed surface of the plaque must not exceed eighteen square inches (3 inches x 6 inches). Plaques that exceed the size limit will not be installed onsite.
