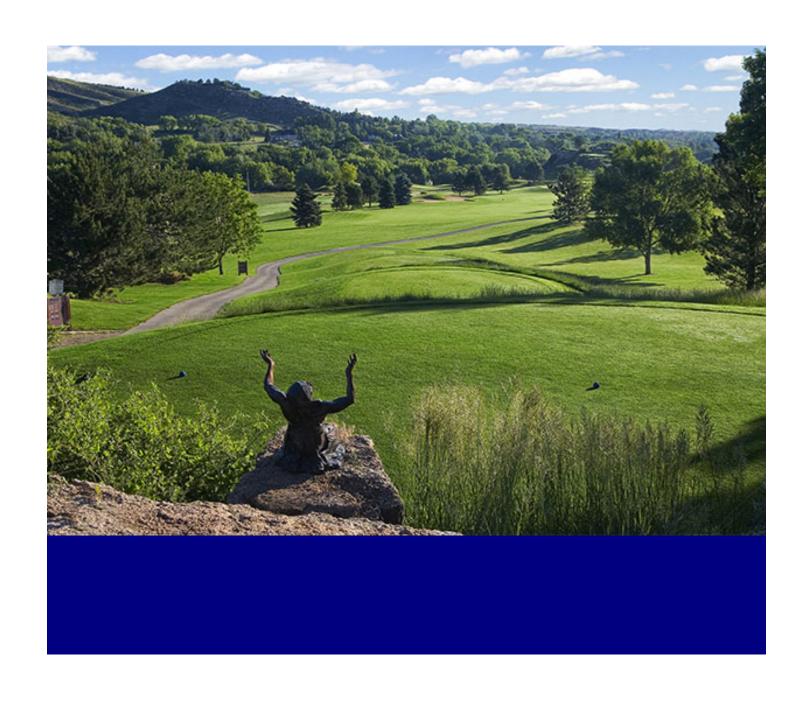

## FINAL REPORT MESSAGE

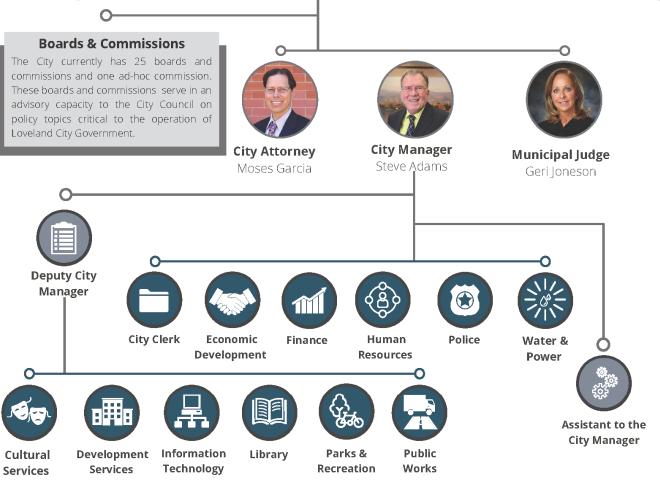

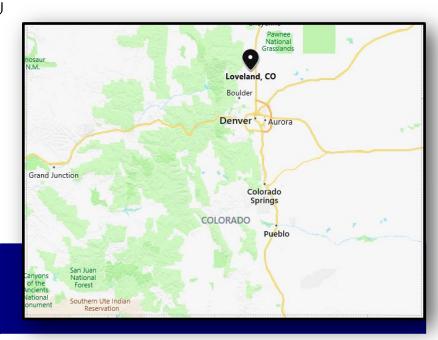

The City of Loveland Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for the year ended 2022 from which the information in the Citizen's Financial Report has been drawn, was awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA), for 2021. The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition for excellence in state and local government financial reporting.

In order to be awarded a Certificate of Achievement, a government unit must publish an easily readable and efficiently organized comprehensive annual financial report, whose contents conform to program standards. Such Annual Comprehensive Financial Report must satisfy both generally accepted accounting principles and applicable legal requirements.

A Certificate of Achievement is valid for a period of one year only. We believe our Annual Comprehensive Financial Report continues to conform to the Certificate of Achievement program requirements and we are submitting our report for the current year to the GFOA.



## **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

The following is a list of some of the many accomplishments completed during 2022.

#### **Parks and Recreation**

♦ Completed the replacement irrigation system at the Cattail Creek Golf Course., at a cost of \$1.3 million.

#### **Wastewater Treatment**

♦ Completed the upgrade of the water reclamation facility administration area and replaced lab testing appliances at the cost of \$1.0 million.

#### **Water and Power**

♦ Continued construction on Chimney Hollow reservoir which will hold 90,000-acre feet of water when completed and filled. The City's share will be 10,000-acre feet of storage in the reservoir. Budget is \$77.4 million with costs to date of \$75.6 million.

Achieve Loveland's community vision through innovation, dedication and excellent service.

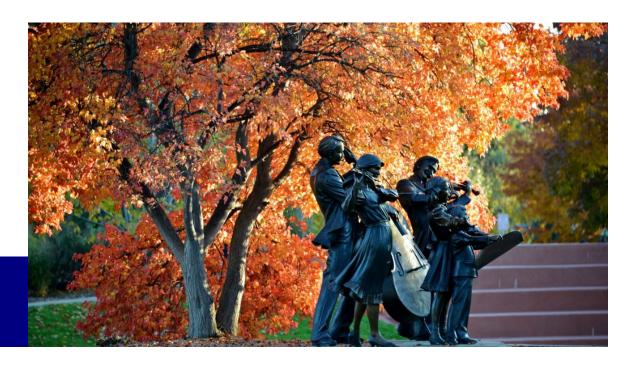




## STATEMENT OF NET POSITION

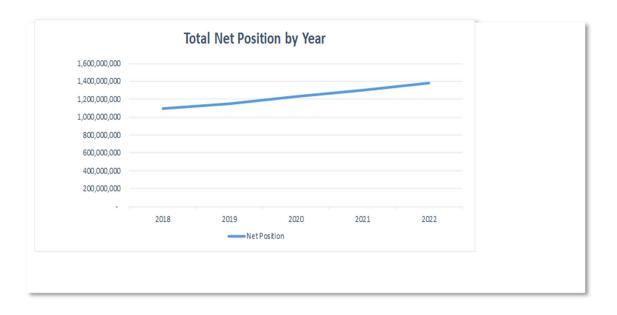




## **INCOME STATEMENT**

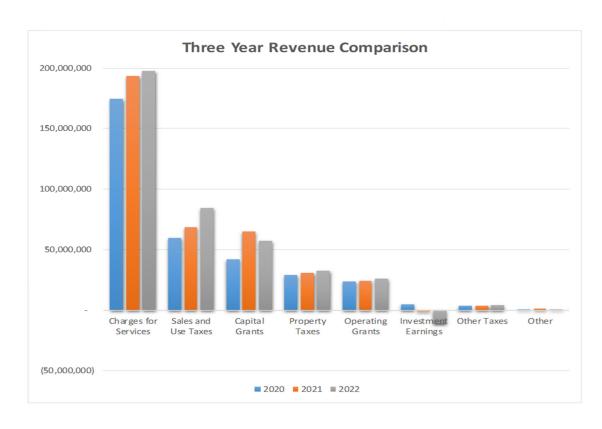

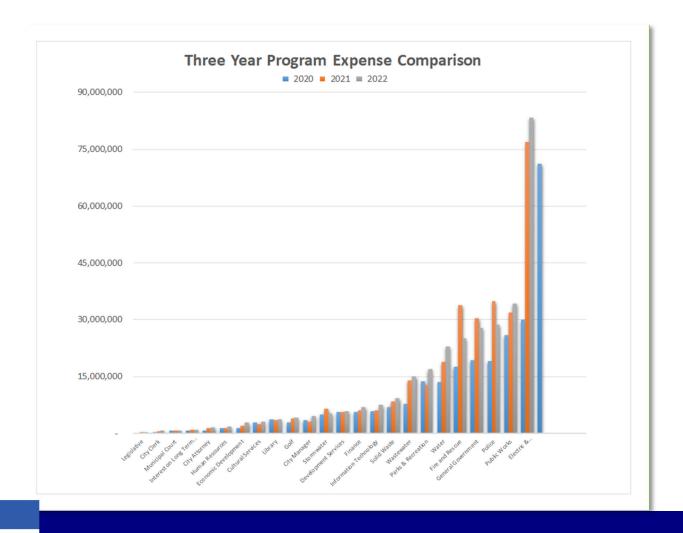
