# Item 5.1: Fort Collins-Loveland Water District Intergovernmental Agreement - Melissa Morin

This item presents the proposed Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the City of Loveland and the Fort Collins-Loveland Water District.

#### Recommendation:

Adopt a motion recommending that the City Manager sign the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between the City of Loveland and the Fort Collins-Loveland Water District (FCLWD) on behalf of the City.

**Second: Randy Williams** seconded the motion. The motion was **approved** unanimously with a **7-0 vote**.

#### Item 5.2: Highway 402 Utility Service Project - Phase II Final Design Contract - John Faulkner

The Highway 402 Utility Service project was broken into three phases in the original contract for professional services. Phase I - 50% Preliminary Design which is covered under the current HDR Engineering (HDR) existing contract, Phase II - Final Design, and then Phase III - Construction which includes Services During Construction (SDC'S). The City is anticipating that we will receive the 50% design drawings the first week of September 2023, for the water, sewer, electrical, and fiber optic utilities along the HWY 402 corridor from South St. Louis to County Road 9. This request is to receive approval from LUC to amend the HDR design contract for professional services to cover the Phase II - Final Design of the Highway 402 Utility project.



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Recommendation: Adopt a motion approving the change order to the contract with HDR Engineering for Phase I to include Phase II - Final Design professional services, increasing the not-to-exceed contract amount to \$1,669,420, and authorizing the City Manager to sign the change order on behalf of the City.

Motion: Gary Hausman made the motion.

Second: Matt Elkins seconded the motion. The motion was approved with a 6-0 vote. Dan Herlihey recused himself from this vote as an employee of HDR Engineering.

#### STAFF REPORTS

Item 6.1: Platte River Power Authority Integrated Resource Planning – Javier Camacho and Masood Ahmad The Platte River's Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) is a comprehensive, long-term strategy that efficiently meets projected energy demand through a balanced integration of supply and demand side resources. Its primary goal is to determine the optimal combination of resources for reliable, cost-effective and environmentally sustainable electricity supply to customers. Supply side resources include renewables and dispatchable sources, with considerations for availability, cost and environmental impact. Additionally, the IRP considers demand side resources and engages public input for community alignment. Regular reviews and updates adapt the plan to changing circumstances, technologies and regulations. Mandated by Western Area Power Administration (WAPA) every five years, the IRP paves the way towards a cleaner, greener and resilient energy future.

# Item 6.2: Proposed 43rd Street Water Storage Tank – John Faulkner

In order to meet future demand, diurnal demand patterns and fire flows, the City P1 Pressure Zone needs additional water storage. Therefore, the City has long planned and budgeted for a new water storage tank at the west end of 43rd Street, next to the existing tank, to be designed in 2023 and constructed in 2024.
