The City of Loveland entered into an agreement with SmartWorks, a division of N. Harris Computer Corporation for Software as a Service on December 29, 2018. The parties amended the contract with a series of seven (7) change orders executed between February 8, 2022, and September 14, 2023. Due to an inadvertent staff error and misinterpretation of City procurement regulations, the City's execution of the change orders was not consistent with the City's Administrative Regulation AR-000001 (Procurement Regulation) or the Loveland Municipal Code Chapter 3.12 (Procurement). The parties desire to ratify the execution of the Change Orders via an amendment to the contract.
