### CULTURAL SERVICES BOARD MINUTES Tuesday, March 23, 2010 4:30 P.M.

The March 23, 2010 meeting of the Cultural Services Board was called to order at 4:35 p.m. by Juanita Cisneros in the Upstairs Conference Room of the Loveland Museum/Gallery.

### Additions or Corrections/Changes to the Minutes

There were no changes to the February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2010 minutes. Peggy Schwarz moved to accept the minutes, Kris Ortmann seconded. All approved.

#### **Board Reports**

Juanita Cisneros wanted to recognize Rose Watson for her creative efforts at the Boards and Commission Meeting. Rose prepared a creative skit as the presentation for the Cultural Services Board and it was well received.

#### **Museum Reports**

#### Summer Concerts

Kim Akeley-Charron shared a preliminary listing of the summer concerts scheduled for the Foote Lagoon beginning on June 17<sup>th</sup>. The 2010 season will include 8 concerts consisting of 4 returning and 4 new performers. Kim will also be seeking additional volunteers to help with crowd control for the *Elders* concert on July 8<sup>th</sup>. *The Elders* brought in very high numbers last year and she expects another highly attended event again this year.

### **Cherry Pie Celebration**

Cherry Pie Celebration will be held on Saturday, July 24<sup>th</sup> from 5-8 pm. Sponsors include Johnson's Corner, Loveland Historical Society and Davidson Chevrolet. Kim is working with Penguin's Ice Cream for a possible ice cream sponsorship; however, this is not confirmed at this time. The goal is to return this event to its past format and focus on the historical aspect of the cherry industry in Loveland rather than dessert for the BBQ and Summer Fest events. The *Art of the Tart* cherry pie contest will return this year as well. The Cultural Services Board members agreed to man this booth. Potential judges for this contest include a chef/neighbor of Chauncey's and a possible representative from the Reporter Herald. Peggy Schwarz suggested having more judges if the number of entries increases dramatically from last year. In closing, Kim encouraged the board members to meet again in April to finalize plans for booth operations.

## Silver Spoon Film Festival

This year, there were 45 film entries that have been previewed and forwarded to the judges. A new category was added this year to include PSA and commercials. Judges include 2 professors, 1 videographer from the school district and 2 filmographers from Boulder. There were a couple of disqualifications this year due to exceeding the maximum time length. One participant's father sent an email to the Mayor about his son's disqualification in hopes that staff would reconsider the entry. Susan Ison shared this email with the Board and asked for their opinions in this matter. Both Kim Akeley-Charron and Jenni Dobson met with this student. However, they felt that they needed to stick with the published rules that everyone had to abide by. Both the student and his teacher were aware of the time length rules and staff decided that in fairness to all participants who kept their films to the allotted time, they would not allow this student to go back and edit his film after the fact. The Board was in agreement with this action taken by staff and supports their decision. The Board felt that by allowing this entry, a precedent would be established that could make enforcing time limits very difficult in the future. In addition, following time length rules is very important in the film industry and this is all part of the learning process. Susan Ison will follow up with the parent of this student and appreciated the Board's opinion in this matter.

#### Volunteer Hours

Susan shared the total 2009 volunteer hours for the Museum. In total, 3038 hours were donated by volunteers in several areas at the Museum in operations and programming assistance. Jan Sawyer stated that the volunteers at the Rialto recorded 4890+ hours in 2009 as well.

#### Teen Easter Egg Hunt

This year's Teen Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for April 2<sup>nd</sup>. Board members who had volunteered to help with this event were reminded of arrival times and duties.


## Medina Exhibit

The *Bee Week* rack was presented to the Board. The Loveland Museum/Gallery, Rialto Theater and Friends of the Library have worked to create a week filled with fun bee-related activities. The Museum will host a bee exhibit that will be displayed through October in Fireside Gallery. Jan Sawyer shared how great it was for all these activities and groups to come together.



Juanita recommended that staff contact the Reporter Herald for historical photos from when the bee hives had to be removed from out front of the Museum.

## City Employee Movie Day

Jan Sawyer reported on this event for City employees. With all the recent budget cuts, furloughs and no pay increases for employees, Suzanne Janssen came up with great ideas to help boost employee morale without impacting the budget. One of them was a movie at the Rialto Theater. Jan Sawyer offered the Rialto Theater for one day on April 10<sup>th</sup> to host 2 movies just for City employees and their families. Employees have been voting for their choices in movies for the matinee and evening shows. She hoped that maybe this would be something that other city venues would consider doing to offer opportunities for appreciation to City staffers. It is a great way to say "We value you" to the employees.

## Newsletter/E-Newsletter

Michelle Standiford shared copies of the newly re-formatted "Schedule of Events" brochure for the Board to preview. Staff is still finalizing dates and content but hope to have this sent to the printer in the next week to allow for an April 16<sup>th</sup> mail date. This new format should provide for cost savings in both production and mailing. Board members were also asked to provide their email addresses for test runs of the new e-newsletters. Michelle hopes to have the e-newsletters set up with Constant Contact after the brochure is completed. Board members were asked to provide input into the functionality of the email opt-in process and the look of the e-newsletters.

## Children's Day

Susan provided some statistics for the 2010 Children's Day event. Attendance was a little lower than in 2009. This could be due to weather and temperature. The Fire Exhibit was open during this event but saw low attendance. The Board encouraged staff to consider adding that location as a passport stamp site to increase visitors. In addition, they wondered if it would be possible to require more stamps to receive the prize to encourage the kids to visit more locations as well. Staff will take that back to the Children's Day committee for consideration. Peggy Schwarz met Annie, the found of Children's Day, while volunteering at the library and commented that she's an amazing woman with a lot of energy.

# **Rialto Report**

## 90<sup>th</sup> Celebration

To celebrate the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Rialto Theater on May 26<sup>th</sup>, staff will offer 3 events throughout the month of May. *Handsome Little Devils* will perform at the theater on May 7<sup>th</sup>. The silent movie *Peter Pan* will be shown on May 14<sup>th</sup>. The Phyllis Walbye sculpture dedication and movie *Sullivan's Travels* will round out the celebration on May 26<sup>th</sup>. The planter and bike rack have been removed from the front of the Rialto to make room for the plinth for the sculpture. In addition, Jan is seeking financial assistance from the Theater Guild to purchase a bench for out front of the theater as well. This bench will match others located throughout the downtown area.

### **Rialto Bridge**

There are many meetings happening in regards to the Rialto Bridge project. Jan Sawyer is meeting with some of the larger user groups of the Rialto to get their vision on this project. City Council will also be discussing this proposal at the April 13<sup>th</sup> study session. To date, public opinion has been positive.
