## **BOARD & COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS**

Consideration of a motion to appoint members to the Construction Advisory Board, Disabilities Advisory Commission, Historic Preservation Commission, and Loveland Utilities Commission

This is an administrative action recommending Board and Commission appointments. The <u>Construction Advisory Board</u> recommends the reappointment of Jason Baker, Bill Stenberg

and Teri Volk for three year terms effective until June 30, 2014. The <u>Disabilities Advisory Commission</u> recommends the reappointment of Larry Abston, Victor Beebe, Jr., and Diane Hinrichs for three year terms effective until June 30, 2014. The <u>Historic Preservation Commission</u> recommends for reappointment Cara Scohy and the appointment of Matt Newman both to three year terms effective until June 30, 2014. The <u>Loveland Utilities Commission</u> recommends for reappointment Christopher "CJ" McKinney, Eugene Packer and Darell Zimbelman for three year terms effective until June 30, 2014.

MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT – VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS' PENSION SYSTEM Consideration on second reading of an ordinance amending Section 2.60.270 regarding the Volunteer Firefighters' Pension Board of Trustees to reflect the 1966 Intergovernmental Agreement between the City and the Loveland Rural Fire Protection District creating a Joint Board of Trustees and a Consolidated Pension Fund

This is a legislative action to approve on second reading an ordinance amending Title 2 of the Loveland Municipal Code. The amendment clarifies the volunteer firefighters' pension system shall be the Consolidated Firemen's Pension Fund of Loveland and Rural District and the general composition of the Board of Trustees shall be determined by mutual agreement of the City and the Loveland Rural Fire Protection District. The ordinance was unanimously approved by City Council on June 21, 2011.

SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION – TEMPLE HOYNE BUELL FOUNDATION GRANT Consideration on second reading of an ordinance enacting a supplemental budget and appropriation to the 2011 City of Loveland budget for library materials and an interactive play/learning area at the Loveland Public Library

This is an administrative action. Funding from the Temple Hoyne Buell Foundation grant is appropriated for library materials and an interactive play/learning area at the Library. All funding is from the \$15,000 grant and there is no matching requirement. The ordinance was unanimously approved by City Council on June 21, 2011.

A legislative action amending Title 15 of the Municipal Code by adopting by reference eight 2009 International Building Codes. Pursuant to 31.16.203, a public hearing is schedule for the July 5, 2011 regular City Council meeting. Adoption of these codes will allow design professionals to incorporate current construction technologies, methods and materials into building designs. These codes also include updated building safety requirements, such as those relating to existing buildings, structural elements, and fire safety. The ordinances were unanimously approved by City Council on June 7, 2011.

### **MOTORPLEX ENTRY ADDITION ANNEXATION & ZONING**

The ordinance was unanimously approved by City Council on June 21, 2011.

## **MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDMENT - HISTORIC PRESERVATION**

Consideration on second reading of an ordinance amending Title 15 of the Loveland Municipal Code by repealing and reenacting Chapter 15.56 regarding Historic Preservation

A legislative action to approve on second reading an ordinance amending Title 15 of the Loveland Municipal Code. The amendment would:

- Adopt new Historic Residential Design Guidelines to be used by the Historic Preservation Commission when reviewing applications proposing to alter the exterior elevations of buildings on the Loveland Historic Register;
- Add provisions for processing partial demolition permits for properties on the Loveland Historic Survey; and
- Clarify process procedures.

The ordinance was unanimously approved by City Council on June 7, 2011.

### **MAY 2011 INVESTMENT REPORT**

This is an information only item. No Council action is required. The budget estimate for investment earnings for 2011 is \$3,163,130. For the first five months of 2011, the amount posted to the investment account is \$1,259,936 including realized gains. Actual year-to-date earnings are lower than the year-to-date projection by \$58,035. Based on May's monthly statement, the estimated annualized yield is about 2.01%, just over the annual target rate. Interest rates are trending lower, but annual returns should still meet the target.
