FINAL DOCUMENT REVIEW FOR NORTH I-25 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

This is a discussion item. The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), has just released the Final North I-25 Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) document for review. The City of Loveland has been involved in the EIS since the process began in 2004. The official review period is from August 19, 2011 to September 19, 2011. On August 30, 2011 the comment period was extended to October 3, 2011. As part of this review period, CDOT is requesting that the City of Loveland, as one of the participating local agencies, provide comments back to the Project Team.

INVESTMENT REPORT JULY 2011

This is an information only item. No Council action is required. The budget estimate for investment earnings for 2011 is \$3,163,130. For the first seven months of 2011, the amount posted to the investment account is \$2,000,643 including realized gains. Actual year-to-date earnings are higher than the year-to-date projection by \$232,497. Based on July's monthly statement, the estimated annualized yield on the U.S. agencies and corporates was up to 1.64%, still under the annual target rate. Interest rates have dropped significantly lower.
